

Postdoctoral Researcher in Space Policy

We are seeking a highly motivated and skilled Postdoctoral Researcher in Space Policy to join our academic and interdisciplinary team.

This <u>full-time position of two years</u> is based at the International Space University ISU in Strasbourg, France. It is part of a John Templeton Foundation grant in close cooperation with the Space Policy Institute at George Washington University (GWU). Joint activities in the USA are part of this project.

The successful candidate will investigate how international cooperation in deep space exploration may evolve with the aim of finding common values among current and potential space stakeholders. These stakeholders should represent many different disciplines ranging from engineering to philosophy as well as being representative of space-faring and emerging space nations.

The successful candidate will have opportunities for professional development and networking within the field of space policy or a related field of interest.

Responsibilities:

	external partners to design and conduct surveys, interviews, and
	workshops aimed at understanding the perspectives and
	priorities of different space-faring and emerging space nations;

Qualifications:

A Ph.D. or equivalent in a relevant field such as political science,
international relations, space policy, or a related discipline. The
degree should have been awarded within the past 2-3 years.
Strong background and research expertise in space policy and
international relations, or related areas.
Knowledge of space treaties, agreements, and governance
frameworks and an understanding of the geopolitical factors that
influence space activities.
Strong written and verbal communication skills, including the
ability to write for both academic and policy-oriented audiences
in English.
Ability to work effectively both independently and as part of a
multidisciplinary team, collaborating with researchers from
diverse backgrounds.
Experience presenting research findings at workshops and
conferences, and publishing in peer-reviewed journals is
desirable.
Experience in conference organization and grant writing would be
an asset
